

ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION, PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE ELECTION, INCLUDING GIVING NOTICE OF THE ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS :
COUNTIES OF HALE AND FLOYD :
PLAINVIEW INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT :

WHEREAS, this Board of Trustees of Plainview Independent School District (the “District”) deems it advisable to call the election hereinafter ordered; and

WHEREAS, such election is subject to the provisions of Section 45.003, Texas Education Code, and the District is contracting with Floyd County, Texas, in which a portion of the territory of the District is located, for the conduct of the election as a joint election in Floyd County in accordance with Chapter 271, Texas Election Code, and for the administration of the election in Floyd County pursuant to an interlocal agreement with Floyd County (the “Floyd Election Contract”); and

WHEREAS, the District is contracting with Hale County, Texas, in which a portion of the territory of the District is located, for the use of election equipment in accordance with Chapter 123, Texas Election Code, but not as a joint election with Hale County; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that said meeting was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by the Government Code, Chapter 551.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF PLAINVIEW INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

1. An election shall be held between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 7:00 P.M. on November 5, 2019 (“Election Day”). Election Day voting in Floyd County for District voters residing in Floyd County is to be administered by Floyd County as provided by Chapter 271 of the Code and the Floyd Election Contract. Election Day voting for District voters residing in Hale County is to be administered by the District. Voting on Election Day shall occur during the hours and at the designated polling places set forth in Exhibit “A” attached hereto, which exhibit shall be modified without further action of the Board required, to include additional or different Election Day polling places required to conform to the Floyd Election Contract (with respect to voting in Floyd County) and the Code (with respect to voting in both Counties).

2. The Board hereby approves the Floyd Election Contract and authorizes the Board President or Superintendent to sign and deliver such agreement on behalf of the District. The early ballot board, election administrator, election judges and clerks, early voting judges and early voting clerks and all other election officers designated pursuant to law and the Floyd Election Contract by Floyd County are hereby appointed and confirmed to hold the election at polling places and all early voting places for voting by District residents who reside in Floyd County. The Floyd County Clerk may employ other personnel necessary for the proper administration of the Election, including such part-time help as is necessary for the Election, to ensure the timely delivery of supplies during early voting and on Election Day.

3. The Board hereby approves the lease or other acquisition of voting equipment and supplies for use with Hale County voting, and authorizes the Superintendent to execute and deliver on behalf of the District a lease or other equipment use agreement with Hale County in furtherance of such approval.

4. (a) Early voting shall be conducted by personal appearance at the locations and during the period early voting is required or permitted by law, being October 21, 2019 through November 1, 2019, on the dates and at the times as set forth in Exhibit “B” attached hereto, which exhibit, shall be modified

without further action of the Board required, to include additional or different early voting polling places, dates and times as may be necessary or required to the Floyd Election Contract (with respect to voting in Floyd County) and the Code (with respect to voting in both Counties).

(b) Early Voting in Floyd County is to be administered by Floyd County for residents of Floyd County, as provided in the Floyd Election Contract.

(c) Early voting in Hale County, for residents of Hale County, is to be administered by the District.

(d) Applications for early voting by mail must be received by October 25, 2019, and if an application to vote by mail is made by personal delivery, the application must be delivered by the close of business on October 18, 2019. Applications for early voting should be delivered to the following address for residents of the applicable County:

(e) Voting on election day for District voters who reside in Hale County shall be administered by the District. The election officers for persons residing in the District and in Hale County Precinct Nos. 101, 102, 103, 104, 105, 110, 111, 112, 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 304, 305, 306, 307, 308, 406, 407, 408, 409, 419 and 420 (Ollie Liner Center) shall be:

Presiding Judge: Christina Salazar

Alternate Presiding Judge: Sandra Munoz

The election officers for persons residing in the District and in Hale County Precinct No. 213 (Lemond Community Center) shall be:

Presiding Judge: Mirayah Barrios

Alternate Presiding Judge: Dalia Pardo

Each Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two nor more than five qualified election clerks to serve and assist in conducting said election; provided that if the Presiding Judges actually serve as expected, the Alternate Presiding Judge for the assigned precinct shall be one of such clerks.

(f) An early ballot board is hereby created to process early voting results in Hale County, and Rosie Licerio is hereby appointed as the presiding judge of said board. The presiding judge shall appoint at least two other members of the board. District employees may serve as deputy early voting clerks, and the presiding judge of the early voting ballot board may appoint other deputy early voting clerks to assist in the conduct of early voting as necessary.

(g) With respect to Hale County early voting officials, the appointment of the presiding early voting judges, alternate judges, early voting clerks, and other election officials for the election shall be made by the Board in the manner prescribed by the Code.

5. All resident, qualified electors of said District shall be entitled to vote at said election.
6. At said election the following PROPOSITION shall be submitted in accordance with law:

PLAINVIEW INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPOSITION A

Shall the Board of Trustees of the Plainview Independent School District be authorized to issue the bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of \$76,620,000 for the purpose of the construction, renovation, acquisition, and equipment of school buildings in the District and the purchase of school buses, with the bonds of each such series or issue, respectively, to mature serially within not to exceed 40 years from their date, and to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the Board of Trustees, in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?

7. The official ballot for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITION with the ballot to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITION to be expressed substantially as follows:

8. Proper notice of said election shall be given and, in all respects, said election shall be conducted in accordance with the Code.

9. The Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Superintendent, President, Vice President or the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to execute or attest on behalf of the District the applicable Election Contracts with each County.

10. In accordance with the provisions of Section 3.009(b) of the Code, it is hereby found and determined that:

- (a) The proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 7 hereof.

(b) The purpose for which the bonds are to be authorized is set forth in Section 6 hereof.

(c) The principal amount of the bonds to be authorized is set forth in Sections 6 and 7 hereof.

(d) As set forth in Sections 6 and 7 hereof, if the bonds are approved by the voters, the Board of Trustees will be authorized to impose and levy annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the annual principal of and interest on the bonds.

(e) Based upon the bond market conditions at the date of adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 4.00%. Such estimated maximum rate is provided as a matter of information, but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds, or any series thereof, may be sold.

(f) The bonds that are the subject of this election shall mature serially or otherwise over a specified number of years (but not more than 40 years from their date), as prescribed by applicable Texas law, though the District estimates that, based on current bond market conditions, such bonds will amortize over a 30-year period from their respective date of issue.

(g) The aggregate amount of the outstanding principal of the District's debt obligations as of the beginning of the District's 2018-19 fiscal year was \$337,688, all of which debt is secured by the District's limited maintenance and operations tax.

(h) The aggregate amount of the outstanding interest on the District's debt obligations as of the beginning of the District's 2018-19 fiscal year was \$17,408, all of which debt is secured by the District's limited maintenance and operations tax.

(i) As of the date hereof, the ad valorem debt service tax rate for the District is \$0.00 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation.
