


Audio Resources Available to Students with Dyslexia or Other Reading Difficulties

In accordance with TEC §28.006 (g-2), Plainview ISD is notifying you of the **Talking Book Program (TBP)**, an audiobook resource that *may be* available to your child.

TEC §28.006 (g-2) requires school districts to notify the parents or guardians of students determined, on the basis of dyslexia screening or reading instrument results **to have dyslexia or a related disorder, or to be at risk for dyslexia or other reading difficulties**, to have access to the Talking Book Program (TBP) maintained by the [Texas State Library and Archives Commission](#). The TBP provides students with reading disabilities the ability to borrow audiobooks free of charge, and it includes over 100,000 titles, hundreds of which are in Spanish.


